Let's be honest: hosting a three-day event with thousands of attendees, dozens of competitions, langar for the masses, and music over loudspeakers louder than the starter pistol it's a mammoth task. And to the management team of the Sikh Games 2025, for pulling this off (mostly), credit is due.

Yes, their plans changed more often than a bride's outfit at a Punjabi wedding. Yes, there were more "urgent" meetings than cold bottles of water. And yes, the communication strategy sometimes felt like it was powered by pigeons and crossed fingers. But here's the truth: they pulled off the impossible.

Yes, the scheduling felt like a spinning charkha with no off-switch. Yes, communication was at times slower than Punjabi uncles leaving a party. And yes, the WhatsApp messages had more drama than a family group chat after a wedding. But despite it all: you made it happen.

Now, let's not ignore the real elephant in the room wrapped in foreign interrfearence and backdoor diplomacy. It was visible, it was awkward, and it was handled with all the courage of a samosa facing a gym diet. Instead of calling out the external hands clearly trying to shape the narrative and dilute the spirit of the sangat, some in management chose the easier path pressuring their own, silencing community voices, and asking critical minds to "tone it down."

That's where we part ways not in gratitude, but in disappointment. Because a platform like this should amplify Panthic voices, not muffle them. Instead of shielding the community from interference, some in the leadership seemed more worried about upsetting their sponsors or contacts than upholding Sikh values of Nirbhau and Nirvair.

Yet, even with all the missteps, the Sikh Games happened. The sangat showed up. The athletes competed. The spirit soared. And yes, the organisers worked hard.

We see that.

We acknowledge that.

It's not easy pulling this off—and for the blood, sweat, and emotional breakdowns behind the scenes: you deserve applause.

Just know next time, we expect more than logistics. We expect leadership.

The kind that runs, prays, and speaks not just about medals, but about morals.

FOREIGN INTERFEARENCE, INDIA TARGETS SIKHS - UNVEILING THE COVERT OPERATIONS



In recent years, Australia has grappled with concerns over foreign interference, with India emerging as a notable actor in this domain. Investigations have unveiled clandestine activities aimed at influencing Australian politics, monitoring diaspora communities, and acquiring sensitive information especially targeting Sikhs

Espionage Activities and Diplomatic Strains

In 2020, Australia's domestic intelligence agency, ASIO, uncovered a "nest of spies" linked to India's Research and Analysis Wing (RAW). These operatives were reportedly involved in cultivating relationships with Australian politicians, surveilling diaspora communities, and seeking classified information on defense and trade. Consequently, two Indian intelligence officers were expelled from the country, and later 4 more.

Targeting the Sikh Diaspora

A significant aspect of India's alleged interference involves the Sikh community in Australia. Reports indicate that Indian authorities have monitored and intimidated Sikh activists advocating for the Khalistan movement. Some activists have reported threats to their families in India, detentions during visits, and direct intimidation while in Australia.

Moninder Singh, a prominent Sikh activist, expressed concerns about the safety of the Sikh community in Australia, warning that unchecked interference could lead to situations similar to those in Canada, where India has been accused of transnational repression.

Australia's Countermeasures

In response to these challenges, Australia has strengthened its legal framework to combat foreign interference. The Department of Home Affairs has outlined strategies to detect, disrupt, and deter such activities, emphasizing the threat they pose to national sovereignty and democratic values.

Detecting whether a person or group is influenced by foreign interference involves observing patterns of behavior, affiliations, and influence that align suspiciously with the interests of a foreign government. In Australia, this issue is taken seriously due to its potential to undermine democracy and national security.

HOW TO IDENTIFY SIGNS OF FOREIGN INFLUENCE

Here are key indicators that a person or group might be under foreign influence:

- 1. Unusual Political or Social Behavior
 - Advocating for foreign government interests in Australia without transparency.
 - Sudden radical shifts in political views aligned with a foreign state's agenda.
 - Promoting propaganda or misinformation that mirrors foreign state media.
- 2. Financial or Organizational Links
 - Unexplained or foreign-sourced funding, especially for political or community activities.
 - NGOs or advocacy groups with opaque financial support or close ties to foreign embassies.
 - Use of shell organizations or front groups to mask foreign origins.
- 3. Harassment or Surveillance
 - Diaspora members being intimidated or coerced to support or silence criticism of a foreign state.
 - People reporting threats to their families back in their country of origin.
 - Surveillance or reporting of minority or activist groups to foreign consulates.
- 4. Espionage or Covert Influence
 - Attempts to infiltrate political parties, universities, media outlets, or religious institutions.
 - Intelligence officers cultivating "assets" in Australian public life (politicians, academics, businesspeople).
 - Any threats or harm experienced

HOW TO IDENTIFY FOREIGN INFLUENCE IN SIKH INSTITUTIONS & GURDWARAS

- 1. Narrative Control & Suppression of Sikh Issues
 - Gurdwara leadership avoids or censors discussions about Sikh genocide (1984), Khalistan, or political prisoners.
 - Hostility or silencing of community members who speak on Sikh sovereignty, self-determination, or human rights.
 - Promotion of Indian state narratives, such as "Sikh extremism" or "national unity" rhetoric.
- 2. Unusual Leadership behaviour or Interference in Elections
- Gurdwara elections are manipulated or dominated by one group, especially individuals with ties to Indian consulates or Indian-linked political parties.
- Community members opposing these groups are harassed, disqualified, or discouraged from participating.
- New committee members arrive with unknown backgrounds, but quickly gain influence.
- 3. Foreign-Linked Funding or Resource Offers
 - Sudden influx of funds from unknown or foreign sources, especially from India.
 - Sponsored "cultural" events that promote Bollywood nationalism over Sikh history.
 - Offers of infrastructure improvements or "donations" tied to conditions (e.g., restricting topics or speakers).



HOW TO IDENTIFY FOREIGN INFLUENCE IN SIKH INSTITUTIONS & GURDWARAS

- 4. Presence of Known Indian Agents or Affiliates
 - Individuals connected to Indian intelligence (RAW) or pro-India lobby groups are regularly seen around Sikh institutions.
 - Ties to groups like RSS-linked organizations, Indian High Commission, or Indian political party cells.
- 5. Intimidation or Reporting on Sikh Activists
- Gurdwara leadership or volunteers report Sikhs to Indian consulates.
- Visiting Sikh youth or activists face threats, character assassination, or are called "terrorists."
- Families in Punjab are targeted after activism in Australia or Canada.
- 6. Media or Photo Ops with Indian Officials
- Committee members appear in Indian embassy photos, or host Indian diplomats in Gurdwaras under the guise of "culture."
- Public statements or social media that praise Indian leadership or oppose Sikh independence.

This is a key pattern of foreign interference, particularly within diaspora communities like Sikhs in Australia, Canada, the UK, and beyond.

1. Same Faces, Different Fronts

You will often notice a small group of individuals or their close friends, family, or business partners occupying leadership roles across multiple Sikh institutions:

- Gurdwara committees

They create a closed loop of influence, ensuring that no dissenting or grassroots Sikh voices can rise without being discredited or blocked.

The Goal: Raise personal status, access funding, secure political favors—and, in some cases, influence or undermine Sikh activism.

3. Narrative Control Through "Branding"

They cleverly:

- Talk about Sikh issues just enough to seem legitimate (e.g., langar, youth, Vaisakhi), but avoid core justice issues like 1984, self-determination, or Punjab rights.
- Label genuine activists as "extremists" or "divisive."
- Use Gurdwaras to project state-friendly narratives, such as:
- "We are Australian first, Sikhs second."
- "Khalistan talk is outdated."
- "India is a democracy let's focus on harmony."
- 4. Visible at Indian Consulate Events

Despite claiming to stand for Sikh rights:

- These individuals are regularly seen at Indian High Commission events.
- Appear in photos with Indian government officials, often during "Independence Day" or "Republic Day" celebrations.
- Publicly thank Indian diplomats for "supporting the community," which raises red flags.

Their loyalty and alignment with Indian state interests becomes clearer over time.

- 5. Use of Media & Social Platforms to Cement Legitimacy
- Run or influence Sikh community radio shows, Facebook pages, or local publications.
- Filter who gets to speak—only inviting those who echo the official or watered-down narrative.
- Discredit or exclude dissenters by calling them "troublemakers," "extremists," or "outside influences."

SIKH GAMES 2025 - AKALITIMES GAMES BEFORE THE GAMES

In what was meant to be a celebration of unity, community spirit, and cultural pride, a disturbing undercurrent of suppression, silencing, and foreign interference unraveled before and during a recent high-profile sporting event involving Sikh participation in Australia.

As the Sikh community prepared to come together not just to compete, but to raise awareness on pressing issues such as foreign interference and the transnational repression of Sikh voices an invisible hand moved swiftly behind the scenes to ensure one thing: SILENCE.

Backchannel Messages & Subtle Warnings

In the lead-up to the games, multiple covert messages were relayed through various individuals, urging attendees not to bring Khalistan flags, not to speak about Indian interference, and to avoid raising issues around transnational repression. These warnings weren't official, but they were persistent and coordinated.

Emails to Sikh Games management requesting permission to speak or raise a Sikh human rights booth were ignored entirely. When community members followed up, there was either radio silence or vague excuses. Meanwhile, some members of the organizing body reportedly began discouraging visible Sikh political expression, hinting it might "cause tension" or "bring unwanted attention."

Misinforming Authorities & Creating a False Narrative

Perhaps most alarming was the role of misinformation fed to local police authorities by event organizers or affiliates. Police were reportedly told that Khalistan supporters posed a threat to public order, despite zero evidence of any violent intent.

This strategic misrepresentation was aimed to allow the management to preemptively shut down dissent under the guise of safety, portraying activists as agitators rather than peaceful participants.

The Shameless representatives even went to the length to misinform police that Sikh Youth might drink and create rukus as such more police presence is required. The offer to Pay and Hire Police was also on the table.

SCARE TACTICS & INTIMIDATION

A coordinated campaign of intimidation emerged alongside these suppressive moves:

- Sikh athletes and performers known to be vocal on Khalistan or foreign interference issues found their registrations quietly cancelled no reason given.
- The community was repeatedly told to "not talk bad about India," a message that was echoed not just casually, but with underlying tones of consequence.
- Several community members reported being followed, watched, and interrogated informally by individuals whose loyalties were unclear but whose purpose was evident.

The overarching message was clear: "Keep your sovereignty out of this event or face consequences."

DEATH THREATS & ABUSIVE MESSAGES

The suppression didn't stop at mere words.

One prominent Sovereign Sikh member received a direct death threat via phone a chilling call that clearly stated the cost of speaking up.

Then came written death threat, while yet another was bombarded with abusive and vulgar messages meant to instill fear, anger, and shame.

These were not isolated incidents. They were coordinated attempts to psychologically destabilize and silence activists pushing for Sikh self-determination and raising concerns about Indian government interference in sovereign nations like Australia.





In the face of intimidation, misinformation, and a rising tide of foreign interference, Sovereign Sikhs have taken a bold, principled stand for their rights and freedoms meeting directly with Australian authorities to ensure that their voice will not be silenced.

In a series of proactive engagements, representatives from the Sovereign Sikh movement met with officials from Home Affairs, the Hate Crime Division, the Australian Federal Police (AFP), and Bankstown Police ahead of the upcoming Sikh Games. The purpose was clear: to affirm their unshakeable commitment to raising critical issues, to challenge suppression, and to ensure that the events remain a space of integrity, safety, and Sikh sovereignty.

IF SPEAKING TRUTH INVITES VIOLENCE, SO BE IT

During these discussions, the Sovereign Sikh representatives clearly conveyed their stance that they would raise their concerns, flags, and voice, even if it meant risking backlash. The message was not rooted in defiance, but in the spirit of democratic participation and lawful protest.

Authorities responded with reassurance. Officials across the board including from the Department of Home Affairs, Hate Crime Division, and Australian Federal Police affirmed that it is the fundamental right of every person in Australia to express themselves freely, provided it is within the bounds of the law. The police acknowledged that the Australian Constitution guarantees this freedom, and committed to upholding it.

DEATH THREATS UNDER INVESTIGATION

The Sovereign Sikh team also formally informed law enforcement about ongoing death threats and abusive messages received by their members. Police took these reports seriously and have launched active investigations to identify those responsible.

The threats were seen not just as attempts to silence individuals, but as part of a broader campaign to stifle Sikh voices especially those who are critical of Indian state actions or advocate for Sikh self-determination.

WILLING TO TALK - BUT NOT TO SURRENDER

Importantly, the Sovereign Sikhs emphasized that they were open to dialogue with event organizers if needed, to de-escalate any misinformation or concerns but they categorically refused to compromise on their core principles.

"We made it abundantly clear," a spokesperson said, "We will bring our Khalistan flags. We will speak our truth. We are not outsiders we are Sikhs, and this is a Sikh event."

The team also shared that legal counsel would be on standby, ready to act in defense of their constitutional rights should any party attempt to suppress or penalize their peaceful actions.

EXPOSING THE FAKE NARRATIVES

During the discussions, Sovereign Sikh representatives presented clear evidence to bust several false narratives being circulated by certain groups seeking to misrepresent Sikh activism.

"We laid out the ground realities, backed by facts, timelines, and community testimonies," said a representative. "The authorities listened, asked questions, and understood the deeper context. This wasn't just about one event it's about a pattern of intimidation that must be stopped."

RAISING THE INDIAN FLAG AT SIKH GAMES? A RED LINE

One contentious issue that surfaced in the meetings was the attempt by certain individuals to raise the Indian national flag at the Sikh Games. Sovereign Sikhs made it crystal clear: such a move would be met with lawful protest.

"This is not an Indian event," they emphasized. "It is a Sikh event, rooted in the spirit of sovereignty, sacrifice, and community identity. The Indian flag is a symbol of state oppression to many in our community especially in light of 1984, ongoing repression in Punjab, and the transnational threats we continue to face."

FAKE NARRATIVE THAT KHALISTAN FLAGS ARE BANNED IN AUSTRALIA WERE BUSTED

For years, several pro-India Sikh organisations have pushed a false narrative that Khalistan flags are banned, that councils or authorities don't allow them, and that raising such flags could result in legal trouble. These claims have been used to intimidate and mislead everyday Sikhs, silencing them through fear and misinformation.

But this recent event exposed those lies once and for all authorities confirmed unequivocally that flying the Khalistan flag or peacefully expressing political beliefs is completely legal under Australian law, as long as it is done peacefully. This moment shattered the deceitful narrative and empowered the community with truth.

If anyone tells you the Flags are banned you can file a complaint of intimidation with the authorites as they are being malicious and probably working for the Indian State

WHY DID SIKH GAMES TURNED LIVE AKALITIME TELECAST OFF WHEN TRANSNATIONAL REPRESION AND FOREIGN INTERFEARENCE WERE BEING DISCUSSED.

When the livestream suddenly cuts off right when the topic of Transnational Repression and Foreign Interference is raised, it's not a coincidence it's a calculated decision.

A decision made under pressure. But pressure from who, and for what?

The mindset ignores this fact: Silencing the truth helps the oppressor, not the oppressed.

WHY DID THE SIKH GAMES INTENTIONALLY KILL THE LIVESTREAM?

It means that even in spaces created by Sikhs for Sikhs, our voices are still being policed. Not by just outsiders but by fear, money, and compromised leadership.

Turning off the livestream was more than just a tech glitch it was an act of suppression.

We call on the Sikh Games to publicly explain this act of censorship. And we call on the global Sikh community to remain vigilant, courageous, and committed to defending our freedom not just in words, but in action.

SIKH GAMES 2025 WHY THE SUPPRESSION? WHERE DID THE PRESSURE COME FROM?

We don't have to look far to understand the motives or the sources. When a community event in Australia starts mirroring the talking points of the Indian state, when discussions on Sikh sovereignty are taboo but Indian nationalist sentiment is tolerated, we must ask:

- Who benefits from this silence?
- What pressure was placed on organizers?
- How far is foreign influence reaching into our supposedly free democratic spaces?

All signs point to coordinated pressure from Indian diplomatic missions backed by informal influence networks and local enablers aimed at painting the global Sikh voice as a threat, while burying the real issue: India's own record of repression against minorities and dissidents.

A CLEAR MESSAGE: "KILL THE VOICE, NOT THE TRUTH"

What happened during the games was more than censorship. It was a calculated effort to silence, isolate, and criminalize Sikh identity, especially for those speaking out against Indian state violence and repression.

But the Sikh community has seen this before.

From Delhi in 1984 to Melbourne in 2024, the playbook is the same: discredit, divide, and destroy the dissent. Yet despite threats, intimidation, and censorship, one truth remains: Sikhs will not be silenced.

We will continue to raise our voices for justice, for freedom, and for the right to speak without fear in countries that claim to champion democracy.

When the rubber meets the road—like during key political moments, human rights issues, or mobilizing global Sikh support for sovereignty many of these so-called "Sikh organizations" in Sydney often go silent, play safe politics, or focus on symbolic activism rather than real grassroots movement-building.

Who Are These Orgs?

Sydney has a number of Sikh bodies like gurdwara committees, youth groups, and cultural orgs that sometimes use buzzwords like sovereignty, freedom, or self-determination" but rarely act on them in any politically effective way.

Why the Silence?

- Fear of losing the seat of power within their circle in Australia.
- Fear of backlash from Indian diplomatic channels.
- Internal divisions or egos between groups.
- Funding dependence on people who don't want to rock the boat.
- Comfort in charity work over confrontation with global systems of injustice.

Real Sovereign Talk vs. Lip Service

Most organizations use panethnic language when it suits their image Shaheedi events, martyr tributes, social media clout, media but when it comes to

- Building a solid political movement,
- Challenging the Indian state publicly,
- Aligning with global Indigenous or decolonial struggles,

they often go missing. Real talk on Sikh Raj, UN advocacy, legal international rights, or exposing genocide with full historical truth is rarely led by these organizations.

Where Are the Real Voices?

You'll find more grassroots firepower among:

- Diaspora youth collectives operating outside gurdwara politics.
- Online educators and researchers who study the Khalsa Raj movement, 1984, and post-colonial resistance.
- Non-aligned individuals building real solidarity with First Nations and oppressed communities in Australia.



As we approach the upcoming federal election in New South Wales, it is vital that the Sikh Australian community is heard and represented. We believe that the issues impacting Sikh Australians, including the right to religious freedom, political representation, and protection from foreign interference, must be addressed by all candidates. With increasing concerns about India's influence and transnational repression, it is essential to hold our political leaders accountable for their views and stances. The following questions are designed to help guide conversations with candidates, providing an opportunity for them to outline their vision and commitment to the Sikh community in Australia.

10 QUESTIONS FOR ALL FEDERALAKALI TIMES CANDIDATES IN NSW

- Representation & Inclusion: What is your vision for greater inclusion of Sikh Australians in federal policymaking, public service, and national conversations on multiculturalism?

- Visa & Asylum Issues: Many Sikhs fleeing religious persecution in India face visa issues. What will you do to streamline fair refugee and asylum processing for Sikhs?
- Parliamentary Inquiry Support: Would you support a parliamentary inquiry into foreign interference and transnational repression by India in Australia?
- Australia-India Relations: Should human rights issues, including the treatment of Sikhs and farmers in India, be part of Australia's diplomatic discussions with India?
- Community Funding & Empowerment: How will you ensure equitable access to federal funding, grants, and programs for Sikh-led schools, media, and organizations?

- What is your stance on the Khalistan referendum being held peacefully in Australia? Do you support Sikh Australians' right to vote in such initiatives?
- The Liberal Party under Scott Morrison was accused of overlooking Sikh concerns and ignoring Indian government interference. How will you restore trust with the Sikh community in Greenway?
- Will you disclose if your campaign or party is receiving any support, direct or indirect, from Indian government-aligned diaspora groups or foreign-linked influencers?
- As someone seeking votes from the Australian Sikh community, how do you plan to ensure that their interests and concerns are adequately addressed in your policies?
- If elected, will you establish a regular community forum with Sikh leaders in Greenway to stay accountable and informed on emerging issues?
- There is a strong desire among the Australian Sikh community for more political representation and support. How do you plan to give a voice to their issues at the federal level?
- Given your connection to India, how will you ensure that you are representing all Australians, including the Sikh community, without any bias toward India?
- How do you plan to address the specific challenges faced by the Australian Sikh community, including issues related to religious freedoms, cultural representation, and community integration?
- With your ties to the Indian state and leadership, what is your stance on the contentious issues that impact both Sikh diaspora, and how do you plan to manage any potential conflict of interest?
